

Pure and Simple

 Known as 'the little pearl of Schaffhausen', H. Moser & Cie has 50 members of staff and, to date, six in-house calibres. The company's latest model, unveiled at this year's Baselworld, is the Nomad dual time watch, featuring a typical 40.8mm Moser case and housing a manufacture HMC 346 automatic movement. The dial, silver-plated in the rose-gold version and ardoise in the platinum model, boasts applied indexes, an hour and minutes hand, plus a smaller, faceted red hand to indicate the hour in a second time zone. Simplicity is the name of the game here - both in terms of looks and function - setting is via a patented 'double pull' crown system. The dial is completed by an off-centre small seconds at 6 o'clock.





Issue 56 of QP saw us take a deeper look into the science behind Revelation's R02 'magic' watch dial, which appears to turn from black to clear with just a twist of the bezel. This year sees the brand take the concept to its next logical conclusion, with the dial seemingly melting away to reveal the 'tourbillon manège' beneath, in which the complication spins around the centre in a merry-go-round fashion.

The effect is achieved with the clever positioning of two discs whose nanostructures work like shutters, either blocking light or letting it in depending on their positioning. What appears at first sight to be a simple time-only black dial watch can be transformed into a stunning complication within seconds.

The R04 Tourbillon Magical Watch Dial is currently available only in pink gold, highlighted by the black PVD-coated titanium back cover and black rubber strap.

Standing the Test of Time



• Drawing on a history of the manufacture of precision instruments dating back to 1869, Mühle Glashütte's M 29 Classic is a stylish piece of industrial design that is a nod back to the Model 29 indicator gauge produced by the company's original founder, Robert Mühle.

While the Model 29 displayed measurements accurate to up to 1/100th of a millimeter, this latest watch carries on the precision-orientated design with clear and simple second markers and highly-legible red highlights across the dial.

The Sellita SW 200-1 automatic movement housed within the 42mm stainless steel case is equipped with a shockproof woodpecker neck, own rotor and characteristic surface finishes. Available in black or cream dial versions, the M 29 Classic retails for an affordable €1,200 with leather strap or €1,300 with stainless steel bracelet.
